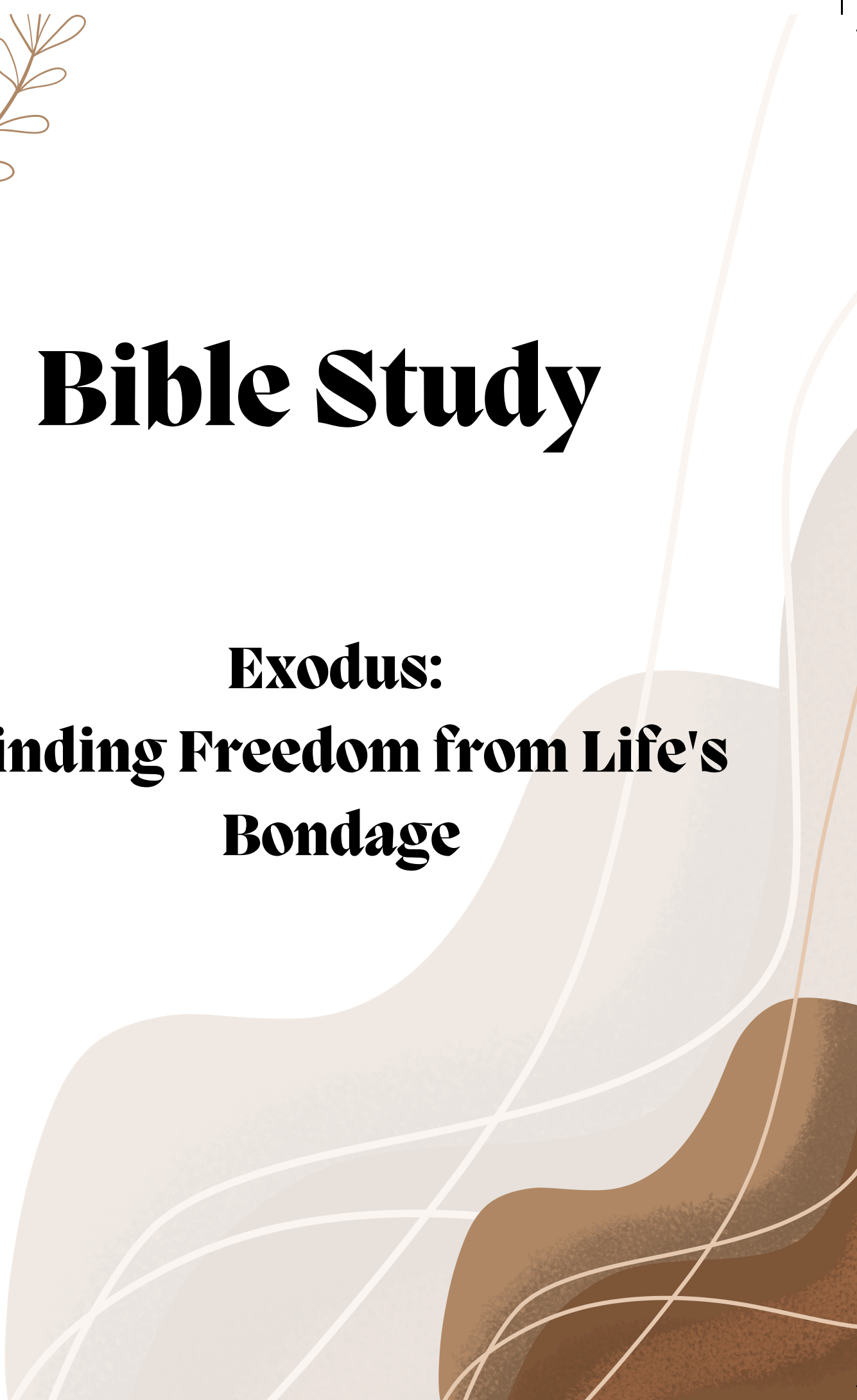
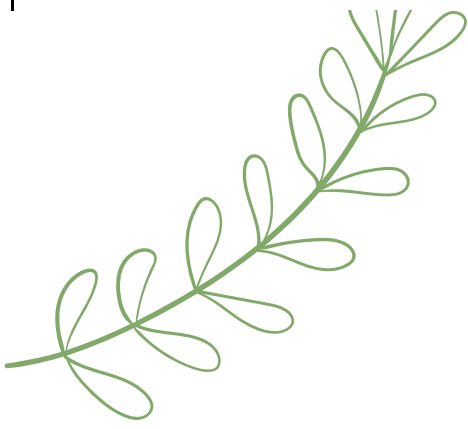




Bible Study

Exodus: Finding Freedom from Life's Bondage

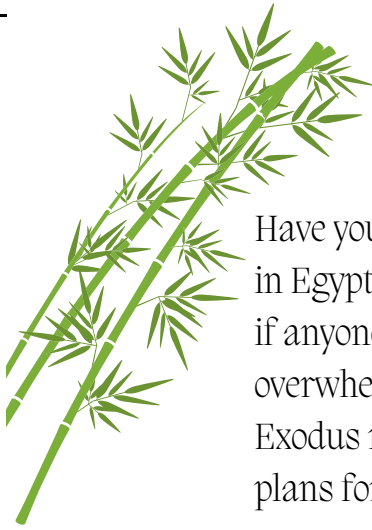

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How can you lean on God's strength instead of your own insecurities?

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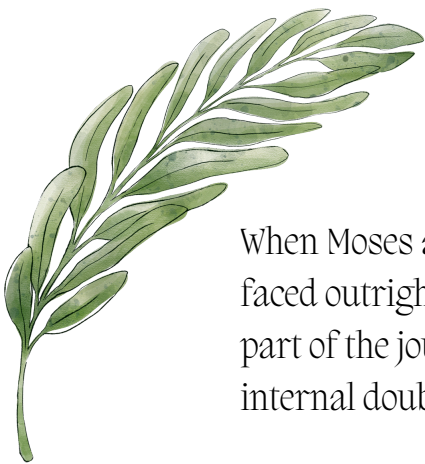
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What truths about God's character give you confidence in His calling?

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Which of the Ten Commandments stands out to you most in this season of life, and why?

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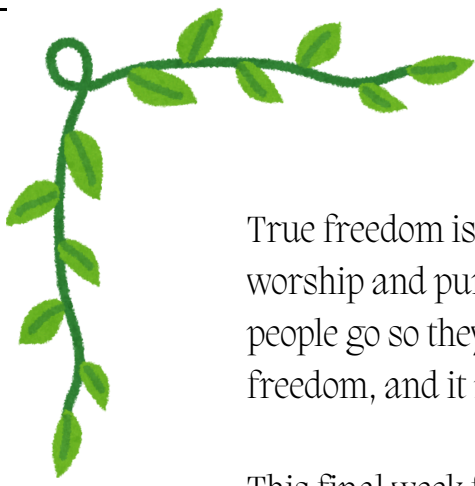
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How can you align your daily life with God's principles of love and holiness?

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What steps can you take to make God's presence the central focus of your life?

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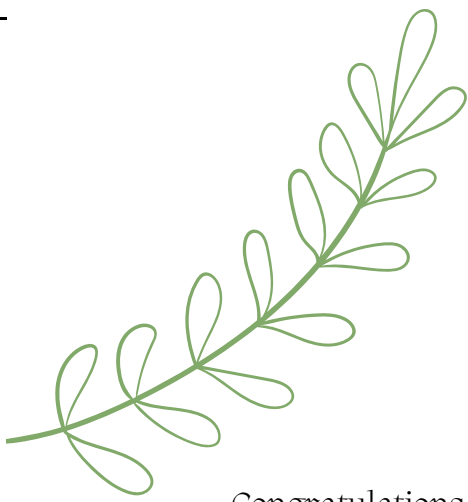
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How does the freedom God gives empower you to live a life of worship?
